Container weight issues remain a focus across the industry, with Pondus fees being applied by all Stevedores where variances to declared weights are found. The rail is continuing to audit the accuracy of vehicle weights and the correct trucks and trailers being manifested.

Similarly, by road it remains vital and a legislative requirement that all loaded containers are accompanied by an accurate and compliant container weight declaration.

An interview with ACS Director, David James.





What made you choose a career in Transport & Logistics?

How did the formulation of ACS come about?

Having been a terrible student at university, I left and had a few random jobs to finance my early adventures and then finally a good friend said it was time for me to get a real job.

Also, the rampant acceleration of landside charges and the number of parties clipping an ever-growing chunk from the ticket yet adding zero value is infuriating. Regulations have become stricter in many ways – and needed to in many cases.
